The lecture will focus on the current state of the nuclear non-proliferation regime and the prospects for nuclear disarmament. Dr. Blix was the UN chief weapons inspector in Iraq before the Iraq war and served as the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) from 1981 to 1997.

Dr. Blix, who currently chairs the independent international Weapons of Mass Destruction Commission (WMDC), is the author of forthcoming *Why Nuclear Disarmament Matters* (MIT Press-A Boston Review Book). In the book Blix argues that the global process of arms control and disarmament has stagnated in the last decade and needs to be revived and pursued in parallel with efforts to prevent the spread of weapons of mass destruction to more countries and to terrorist groups. A book signing will follow the lecture.
